The Seal of Biliteracy:

- Values language as an asset
- Recognizes the value of language diversity and cultural identity
- Prepares students with 21st century skills that will benefit them in our global society, especially during college and job searches
- Provides recognition and evidence for students' proficiency in two or more languages

To be eligible for the Iowa Seal of Biliteracy, each student must demonstrate proficiency in English and a world language through various assessments. Students who earn the Seal of Biliteracy will be recognized during the graduation ceremony, and the seal will be shown on their diploma and official transcript. *Dallas Center-Grimes Testing Information*:

Dallas Center-Grimes will be offering the following time to take the assessments with a proctor present. The school district will cover the cost for administering the initial test, but the students will be responsible for the fees associated with retakes.


Mark Your Calendars! DCG High School Musical Coming

Dallas Center-Grimes High School is one of only seven schools in the entire state of lowa to qualify for the boys and girls state tournaments! This is a significant accomplishment and showcases the hard work of both programs! Thanks for representing DCG at the highest level! Great season Mustangs!



Girls Basketball Finishes in State Quarterfinals - The DCG Girls Basketball team capped off the 2023-24 season at the state tournament! This was DCG's fourth consecutive trip to Wells Fargo Arena. North Polk knocked off the Mustangs in the quarterfinals 48-42. DCG ends the season with a 20-4 record, the fourth-straight season with 20+wins. They also captured their fourth-straight Little Hawkeye Conference title, going 52-2 in that span! A special shout out to the five seniors on this year's roster. Boys Basketball Makes First Trip to 4A State Tournament - The DCG Boys Basketball team qualified for the Class 4A State Tournament for the first time in school history this year. 2023-24 was the Mustangs second year in the state's largest class. DCG was the 8-seed in the Class 4A bracket and dropped a quarterfinal game against 1-seed Cedar Rapids Kennedy. The Mustangs finished the year with a 20-4 record, tying for the top spot in the Little Hawkeye Conference! Joel Rankin's team won nine of their final ten games this winter. DCG says good bye to a incredible senior class. Eight seniors played their final game at Wells Fargo Arena!
