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

FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

Spring is here... I think! We've reached the home stretch of the 2024-25 school year and we've accomplished so many things! Thanks for making this community great!

One of the bigger items on my to-do list this spring is taking another step in our district's commitment to school safety.

All DCG staff members will participate in a "reunification drill" this spring. Establishing a reunification site/strategy is essential in our response to an emergency.



In the event of an emergency at one of our buildings, a reunification site will allow parents and guardians to reunite with our staff and students in an efficient and timely manner. We will not be releasing any of the specifics of these reunification sites/plans to the general public. However, it's important that our stakeholders know we have these plans and we are prepared to use them.

As a reminder, all DCG staff members completed active intruder training during the 2023-24 school year. This work simulated an emergency within our school walls. Our staff members completed an exit survey after the training and nearly 90% of our team said they want to continue with yearly drills. This year's reunification drill is the second step in this process.

Student safety is my top priority and I will continue to do everything I can to make sure our staff has the training and knowledge they need.



Mustangs Reach State Semifinals - Head Coach Adam Jones and the DCG Girls Basketball team had a great run at the 2025 IGHSAU State Tournament! The Mustangs advanced to Class 4A's Final Four, before being knocked from the bracket by North Polk. DCG's path to Wells Fargo Arena was memorable, highlighted, by a thriller in the Region 6 Substate Final against the Carlisle Wildcats. After knocking off the Wildcats, DCG earned the sixth seed in the Class 4A bracket and played the third-seed Maquoketa Cardinals in the state quarterfinal. Ava Smid, led the team with 13 points in the opening round and helped the Mustangs move on to the next round. North Polk's hot shooting was the difference in the semifinals, the Comets won 52-30, ending the Mustangs year with a 20-6 overall record. This was DCG's fifth straight trip to the state basketball tournament.



Boys Basketball Recap - The DCG Boys Basketball team battled all the way through the Region 8 Substate bracket to find a spot in the substate final game but just fell short of the Valley Tigers. After a convincing victory in the first round against Fort Dodge, Head Coach Joel Rankin and the Mustangs played a tight substate semifinal game against the Ankeny Hawks but ended up victorious, winning 76-69. Kyle Cason led the Mustangs with 19 points and 7 rebounds against the Tigers, while both Tate Perrin and Hudson Heidgerken each added 9

points. Although coming up short, the Mustangs gave the Tigers everything they had but ultimately their season came to an end that night and they finished the year with a 19-6 record. The 2024-25 Mustangs were the first team in school history to finish with an undefeated conference record. Congratulations on a great season boys!
