It's hard to believe that we are turning the calendar to May! Today, I want to spend some time highlighting the progress of two major projects at Dallas Center-Grimes - our strategic plan and our facilities master plan.

The DCG Strategic Plan is nearing the final stages. I think back to our first initial meeting with TeamWorks (our partner in this project), and they asked about our top priority. I shaped the answer around a true north,



a vision, a plan, and a commitment for everyone on Team DCG. Through staff, student and family feedback, we defined our theory of action. Through board work sessions, we defined our mission, vision and values. This summer, we will be putting on the finishing touches on DCG's Strategic Plan. When our staff and students return in August, it's go-time. We will be united in our work and ready to take the next step together.

Our facilities master plan is also gaining steam. We've had several focus group meetings with OPN Architects as we truly put together a 10-year DCG facilities plan. This plan will align our immediate needs to solve building capacity issues, while also addressing future growth and renovations. These meetings will continue throughout the summer as we work toward a bond vote in November. Community support is essential to this process and I anticipate several feedback sessions/town hall meetings in the near future. Look for continued updates from me in the Mustang Monthly and our district website throughout the summer.

There are several key projects going on at DCG in 2025, but we will never waver in the commitment of the day-to-day needs of our students and staff. There are incredible things happening every single day! I'm fired up to finish this school year together and celebrate EVERYTHING we've accomplished together.


