#### **VOTERS APPROVE 2025 BOND REFERENDUM**



**Referendum Approved** - On November 4, voters in Polk County and Dallas County approved DCG CSD's 2025 Bond Referendum project! 74.9% of the votes were in favor of the bond referendum project! This was the highest approval rate in the central lowa

area and the second highest approval rate in the state of lowa! Your support of this project will make an immediate impact on each and every student in our district!

**What's Next?** - District administrators are meeting with OPN Architects to develop a project timeline and design plans for each part of the project. This phase includes internal discussions, visits to surrounding school districts for ideas and exploration, and community feedback from DCG CSD students, staff and families.



**When Will Construction Begin?** - The planning and timeline phase will go throughout the winter season. We anticipate the first shovels to hit the ground as soon as snow melts. Installing inclusive playgrounds at our district's elementary schools will be one of the first projects completed.



**School Board Election Recap** - Three spots on the DCG School Board were also up for election on the November ballot. Nick Fiala was reelected in District 1. Monica Malmberg was reelected in District 2. Julie Quandt was elected for the At-Large Director position. All three members were sworn in at our November School Board Meeting.







# Again! Piper Messerly Wins State Cross Country Title -

Piper Messerly claimed a second consecutive Class 4A Cross Country Championship, running a time of 17:41. Her winning time is the 6th fastest in state meet history! Piper's teammate, Tenley Heidgerken finished 3rd in Class 4A with a time of 17:51, the second fastest time in state



meet history by a freshman! Piper and Tenley led the Mustangs to a 4th place finish as a team. DCG has finished in the top five at state nine times in the last eleven years! The DCG Boys Cross Country team finished in 6th place at the 4A state meet. This was the 12th trip to State in the last 13 seasons for DCG, and the 14th trip overall. Since 2014, in their State trips, they've always placed seventh or better. The Mustangs finished second in the Little Hawkeye Conference, with four All-Conference members (Graham Ibeling, Jack Meggison, Harper Gessmann, and Noah Kerndt) and second at the District Meet with four All-District members (Ibeling, Kerndt, Meggison, Gessmann). Ibeling also earned second team all-state honors.







Mustangs Send Two to State Swimming - Two DCG High School students qualified for state swimming as part of our district's partnership with Johnston. Evie Dahm qualified in the 100 breaststroke. Izzy Ernsperger swam the 200 medley relay, 100 fly, 500 free, and 400 free relay. The Iowa State Swimming and Diving Meet was held in Iowa City on November 13 and 14.
